Practice writing the word, then define it before using it within a sentence that makes sense. Look back at the example from Spring 1.

<p>1. English/History Create a timeline of the invasion of the Roman empire. Who were the influential leaders? How many attempts did it take for them to conquer England?</p>	<p>2. History Research different Roman recipes. Is there anything that you can make to bring in and share with your classmates? Write your recipe up in your book.</p>	<p>3. English/ Science Create a short presentation on the various states of matter. Include pictures/ diagrams to show how various objects can change from one state to another.</p>
<p>4. English Write a newspaper article about the eruption of Mount Vesuvius. You can use a computer to make your newspaper article look real.</p>	<p>5. Science Create a word search on states of matter. What scientific vocabulary could you include?</p>	<p>6. English/History Write a diary entry from the point of view of a child witnessing the eruption of Mount Vesuvius. Consider the five w's.</p>
<p>7. Art/RE Create a collage of pictures that represent the importance of Eastertide to you.</p>	<p>8. English/History Create a poster to encourage young people to join the Roman Army.</p>	<p>9. History/Art/DT Make a model of any type of Roman weapon that would have been used in battle. Please include pictures and a description of how you have made it.</p>
