

## Homework Grid: Year 5 – Summer Term 1

Each week choose one activity to complete. We would expect you to spend at least one hour for each piece of work, but you can spend longer if you would like to. Once you have completed one, please ask a parent to initial the box and write the date in it.

<b>1. English/History</b> Create a fact file about William the Conqueror or King Harold. Your fact file must include key information about their life and the impact they had. Pictures must be included.	<b>2. Maths:</b> Create an arithmetic information poster teaching the methods that you are confident with. You could choose addition, subtraction, multiplication or division, or a combination of all calculations.	<b>3. Science</b> Create a short PowerPoint presentation for the class on the adaptation of an animal and their habitat. Your presentation should have a minimum of five slides and all information must be in your own words.
<b>4. English</b> Write your own legend using as much descriptive language as possible. Don't forget to write in the past tense!	<b>5. Free choice</b> Complete a piece of homework about anything you are interested in, presented in a style of your choice. It could be about anything you are interested in – maybe you could teach something new to your teachers!	<b>6. RE</b> Share the story of the Resurrection of Jesus using any genre of writing or presentation style.
<b>7. Maths</b> Go to a supermarket. Choose 5 items and work out what the prices would be if they were reduced by: 10%, 25% and 50%. If you can do that, try working out 5% and 75% discounts.	<b>8. English/History</b> Write a newspaper report on the battle of Hastings. History/Art/DT</b> Make a model of any type of Norman castle. Please include a brief description along with the model.

Choose from these activities each week.

*Finally, don't forget:*

Multiplication Tables: Practice your multiplication tables for ten minutes, three times each week. Your aim is to know all of them up to 12 x 12 fluently.
