Dear parents, children, staff and parishioners,

Welcome back to our new term – Autumn 2. The children have come back looking very smart in their winter school uniform (remember those coats!!!!) and have settled back into their new routines. Thank you for adhering to the updated times at the beginning and end of the day. The end of the day pick up is working really well and we actually managed to dismiss all the children by 3:20pm, which is amazing, so thank you. The weather has started to turn a little colder and we are definitely noticing the autumn leaves falling. Mr Henry loves the daily task of blowing the leaves off the playground! ☺

NOTE – we have had a few children come into school this week where their parents or siblings are displaying one of the symptoms of Covid, or are waiting for the results of a test. If this is the case, then the whole family must isolate at home until the result of the test has been received, otherwise this risks infecting the other children in the year group, resulting in me having to close the whole year group, along with the staff for two weeks. I would really appreciate your support in being extra vigilant and mindful during the National Lockdown...here are a few reminders:

## National Lockdown Update

Dear Parent/Carer,

In light of a changing national picture and an imminent national lockdown I wanted to write to you to thank you for your continued support and provide further reassurance on the position in schools across Coventry.

It is recognised locally and nationally how important it is that, despite national restrictions, our children and young people can maintain as normal a way of life as possible. We are fortunate to have wonderful schools, with excellent and dedicated teachers and staff and we believe that all children should be in lessons, not only to learn, but also for their own mental and physical wellbeing.

We are pleased to be helping your child/children to continue with their education. Where pupils do need to self-isolate, schools will support them to continue with their education using Inspire Remote Learning packages via your school website

We continue to take every measure to make sure our schools are as safe as possible, and I would like to thank you for your continued support in helping our city reduce COVID-19. Schools continue to review risks in their settings and adapt risk assessments, and as a city we share our learning across all schools to ensure we can remain open safely.

Moving into a national lockdown position, there are obviously tighter restrictions for people to adhere to and as a parent or carer there are a number of things that you can continue to do to help make our education settings safe. These are:

- Not sending your child to their nursery, childminder, school or college if they are showing coronavirus symptoms or someone within the household is showing symptoms
- Keeping your child at home where they have been identified as having contact with a confirmed case either in school or elsewhere
- Arranging a test if you or your child develops symptoms – no matter how mild – and informing the nursery, childminder, school or college of the result. Although there were previous problems with testing capacity these have now been resolved
- Ensuring that the whole household isolate where a household member is awaiting a result, and continued isolation if test result is positive
- Reinforcing with your children how to wash hands, make space and minimise contact
- Adhering to the current rules and guidance (including reinforcing with older children for travel to/from school and outside school) which will help reduce transmission
- Adhering to the current rules when you pick up and drop off children at school sites, and ensuring you wear a facemask, maintain a 2 metre distance from other parents (including not blocking entrances, exits, or immediate areas outside of schools)

## Staffing Update

As you are aware, I am currently managing two schools as Executive Principal of Sacred Heart and St Gregory's Catholic Primary Schools. My role was due to end at Christmas, but due to the current Principal (Mrs Marshall) being seconded to a school in Bedworth, the Board of Directors have extended my role. Whilst she is absent for the Spring term, I will continue in role as we move into 2021; this is to provide a smooth transition moving forward as I have a secure understanding of Saint Gregory having worked with them since February 2020. I will be a more visible leader in the school during her absence and will be working with her over the next six weeks to secure a strong handover.



## Sacrament of Confirmation Year 6

As notified through Arbor this week, you will be aware that we have had to move the Sacrament of Confirmation (again 😞) due to the National Lockdown and tighter restrictions in place for places of worship. Therefore, the proposed dates will now be: Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> January 2020 at 6:30pm for Miss Gibson's Class / Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> January 2021 at 6:30pm for Mrs O'Malley's Class (Mrs Davies' Class). This, unfortunately is subject to change due to the ever changing guidance we are receiving from the Government. Again, I am really sorry for the inconvenience.

## After School Clubs – Yr5/6

Due to the tighter restrictions, we have had to make the decision not to proceed with our new football/netball clubs for Year 5 and Year 6. We have now moved these to the Spring Term 2021. This, unfortunately is also subject to change due to the ever changing guidance we are receiving from the Government.

## Sacrament of Reconciliation Year 3

Year 3 have a special Sacrament coming up where they will be taking their First Reconciliation on the 19th and 20th November. They have been speaking to Father Tony this week and they are preparing for this special Sacrament each day. We have sent home the 'Act of Sorrow' for them to practice on the lead up to this significant Sacrament. We know that it will be different this year for children taking their First Reconciliation but this doesn't mean we can't mark it with a celebration. On Wednesday 25th November we invite children to come to school in their own clothes, even party wear, to celebrate this milestone in their Journey of Faith. We will celebrate with games and music and have a fun day with them!

## Food Bank

Father Tony and the parishioners of Sacred Heart have kindly been collecting food for our school community to support families during this difficult time. They have been extremely generous and we have so much food to share. We will be sending home bags of food with the children over the next few weeks. If you don't feel that your family would benefit from this or you would rather not accept the donation then please just return the bag to the school.
