

ARCHDIOCESE OF BIRMINGHAM
PARISH BOUNDARIES
SACRED HEART, COVENTRY

Interpretation of Boundaries:

1. A house or institution belongs to the parish holding the road or side of the road into which opens its principal entrance.
2. A cul-de-sac, crescent, etc., having official opening(s) only onto one road belongs to the parish holding the road or side of the road having such official opening(s), unless the contrary be expressly stated.
3. The boundary always follows the middle of roads, lanes, footpaths, rivers, etc., unless stated otherwise.

Starting in the north-west at the junction of Burlington Road with the Railway Line:

- (1) South along the RAILWAY LINE to Humber Road at Pinley Gardens;
- (2) North-east through PINLEY GARDENS to Aldermoor Lane at the junction of Round House Road and the Moorfields (neither side);
- (3) North along ALDERMOOR LANE to Siddeley Avenue;
- (4) North-east along SIDDELEY AVENUE to Bulls Head Lane (middle of the road to Whitworth Avenue, thence both sides);
- (5) North along BULLS HEAD LANE to Glencoe Road (both sides);
- (6) East along GLENCOE ROAD to its end at the G.E.C. Works (both sides);
- (7) Round the SOUTHERN EDGE OF THE G.E.C. WORKS to the Gate on Bourne Road;
- (8) East along BOURNE ROAD to Brindle Avenue (both sides);
- (9) North along BRINDLE AVENUE to Binley Road (both sides);
- (10) East along BINLEY ROAD to Hipswell Highway (both sides);
- (11) North along HIPSWELL HIGHWAY to Ansty Road (neither side);
- (12) West along ANSTY ROAD to Dane Road (both sides);
- (13) Continuing west along DANE ROAD to Shakespeare Street (both sides)
- (14) North along SHAKESPEARE STREET to Coventry Street (both sides);
- (15) West along COVENTRY STREET to Mercer Avenue (neither side);
- (16) Continuing west straight across along the PATH to Burlington Road;
- (17) West along BURLINGTON ROAD to the Railway Line (both sides).
